

BAYOU STATE REGIONAL HIGH POWER RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIP

April 18, 19, and 20, 2008

Donaldsonville, Louisiana

An NRA-Registered High Power Rifle Tournament

SPONSOR: Palo Alto Rifle & Pistol Club, Donaldsonville, Louisiana

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all NRA members and members of NRA-affiliated junior clubs.

FEES: **Regional:** \$45 adults / \$25 juniors (includes \$9.00 NRA registration). The fee includes admission to the competitors' cookout after the match on Saturday.

Team Match: \$20 per two person team (\$5 for junior teams)

CMP EIC "Leg" Match: \$15 (includes \$10 CMP registration)

Make checks payable to Palo Alto Rifle & Pistol Club.

ENTRIES: Entry for all matches may be made using an SR-1 card, accompanied by check or money order for the full amount of match fees. **NRA membership number and NRA High Power Rifle classification must be recorded on the entry card.** Competitors entering both the Regional and EIC tournaments will be given preference. Non-distinguished shooters will receive preference over distinguished shooters for the EIC match.

Entries by mail close April 13, 2008 and are limited to 60 individuals. Cancellations made before the closing date will receive a full refund. **Entries for the EIC match will be accepted until 8:00 AM Sunday morning, April 20, 2008.**

- DIRECTIONS TO THE RANGE:**
- Take I-10 to the Sorrento/Donaldsonville exit and go toward Donaldsonville.
 - Turn left onto LA 70. (At the caution light)
 - Go across the Sunshine Bridge and into the city of Donaldsonville. (Bear right at the road fork between the bridge and Donaldsonville)
 - Go to the 4th light and turn left onto LA. Hwy. 1
 - Go approximately 3½ miles to LA Hwy. 943. Turn right at the black wooden rail fence. (there is no Hwy. marker at the intersection)
 - Go approximately 3½ miles. The highway will then make a very sharp right turn.
 - The range will be on your left (red gate) approx. 150 yards after the sharp right turn.

SQUADDING: All matches will be squadded. Squadding for individual matches will be issued starting at 7:30 AM. Competitors who fail to be at the proper firing point when their relay is called may lose their privilege to compete in that event.

IDENTIFICATION: NRA membership and classification cards must be shown before squadding.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA Classification system will be used in all matches. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6) or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2) may be used.

RULES: Current NRA high power rifle rules will apply. There will be two categories in Matches 1-7: NRA Match Rifle and Service Rifle. NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3) or Service Rifle (Rules 3.1, 3.1.1, 3.1.2, or 3.1.3) will be allowed in Matches 1-7. Only metallic sights (Rule 3.7a) in Matches 1-7. Ammunition to be proved by the competitor (Rule 3.17). A fee of \$2.00 will be collected IN ADVANCE for each challenge.

TARGETS: SR at 200 yards, SR-3 at 300 yards, and MR-1 at 600 yards

SIGHTING SHOTS: Sighting shots must be taken and scored when allowed in the match conditions. Sighting shots may be taken from any position described in Rule 5. (Except 5.13).

SCORING AND PIT OPERATION: Competitors will be required to perform scoring and pit operation duties. The preferred pit rotation schedule will be a three relay rotation, although four relays will be required for more than 45 competitors.

AWARD SCHEDULE: **Cash awards** for high aggregate score in each category & class will be awarded as follows. There must be five or more entries in a class for one place award; eight or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than five entries in a category (service rifle/match rifle) they will be combined with another category in the same class. If there are still fewer than five entries after combining both categories in a class, there will be no category awards in that class. All competitors will be moved back to their respective categories and combined with the next higher class, until a minimum of five competitors is achieved in the combined class. If there are fewer than five High Masters entered, they will compete for the Regional Championship only. **Camp Perry Credits** will also be issued.

Regional Awards and Special Awards Presentation Plaques will be awarded for the Regional Champion. Category awards will also be presented for Service Rifle Champion and Match Rifle Champion. Special awards will be: Senior (Rule 2.2.1), Woman, and Junior (Rule 2.3). There must be three or more competitors in a special award category for that award to be given. The Regional Champion will not be eligible for Special Awards or Category Awards.

MATCH SCHEDULE: **Friday, April 18, 2008, 10:00 AM**
Two Person Regional Team Match

- Course of Fire: The National Match Course with sighting shots. Pair firing will be used.
- Pit Duty: Each team will provide one person in the pits and one person to score.
- Scores: Scores will be reported to the NRA.

Saturday, April 19, 2008, 8:30 AM
Bayou State Regional High Power Rifle Championship

- Match 1: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target. Rule 5.12.
- Match 2: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, sitting or kneeling from standing, rapid fire, 200 yards, SR target. Rule 5.8 or 5.10.
- Match 3: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone from standing, rapid fire, 300 yards, SR-3 target. Rule 5.6.
- Match 4: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, 600 yards, MR-1 target. Rule 5.6.
- Match 5: The slow fire aggregate. High aggregate scores from Matches 1 and 4
- Match 6: The rapid fire aggregate. High aggregate scores from Matches 2 and 3
- Match 7: The Regional Championship aggregate of scores from Matches 1 through 4

Sunday, April 20, 2008, 8:30 AM
CMP Excellence in Competition “Leg” Match

- This match is open to any US citizen, 14 years of age or older.
- Course of Fire: The National Match Course (Rule 7.14), no sighting shots.
- Arms: Service Rifle, NRA Rules 3.1, 3.1.1, 3.1.2 or 3.1.3.
- Ammunition: Provided by the competitor. Service, commercial, or hand loaded caliber .30, 5.56 mm, or 7.62 mm ammunition consistent with current CMP regulations is authorized.
- Rules: In accordance with CMP Regulations.
- Awards: Provided by CMP.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES: A Competitor Cookout and Awards Ceremony will be held immediately after the completion of firing on Saturday afternoon.
